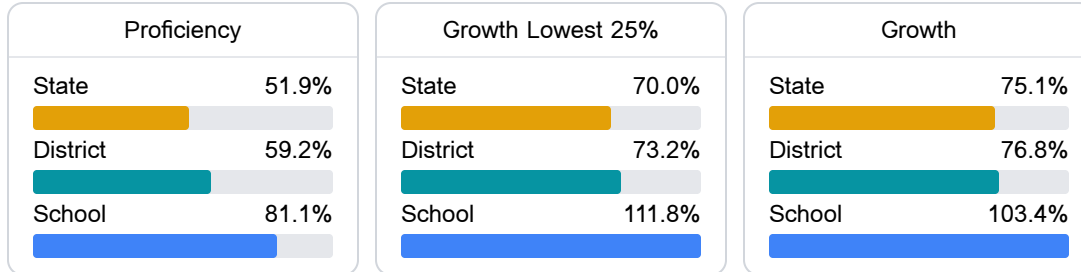

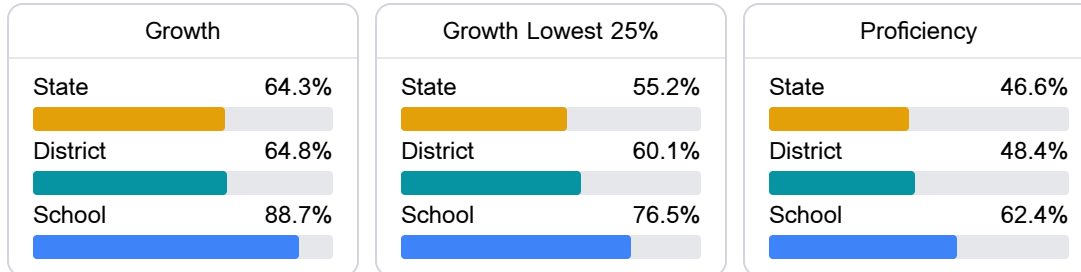
Math

Measurements of student performance on the statewide math assessment.



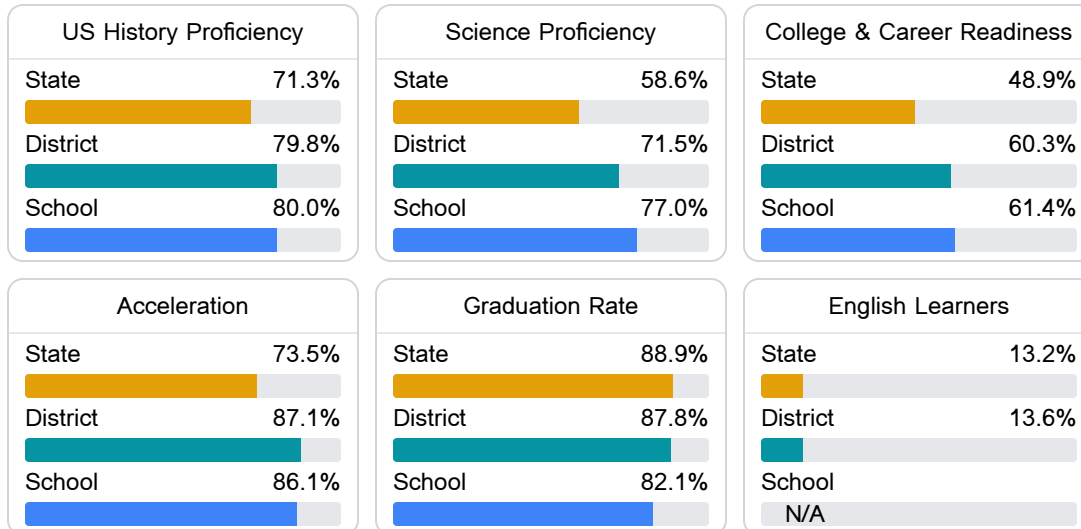
English
